DETERMINING DIAGNOSES AND TREATMENT FOR LEARNING PROBLEMS



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Before a child is diagnosed with attention or learning problems, it is vital to rule out the possibility that your child may have a correctable eye teaming or tracking problem.

Here is a list of some of the more common symptoms of learning related vision problems:

- ☐ Doesn't like to read
- ☐ Skips or rereads lines
- ☐ Prefers to be read to
- ☐ Loss of place when reading
- ☐ Trouble seeing the board
- ☐ Headaches
- ☐ Difficulty remembering what has been read
- ☐ Difficulty paying attention, ADD/ADHD
- ☐ Number/letter reversals such as "b" and "d"
- ☐ Homework takes longer than it should
